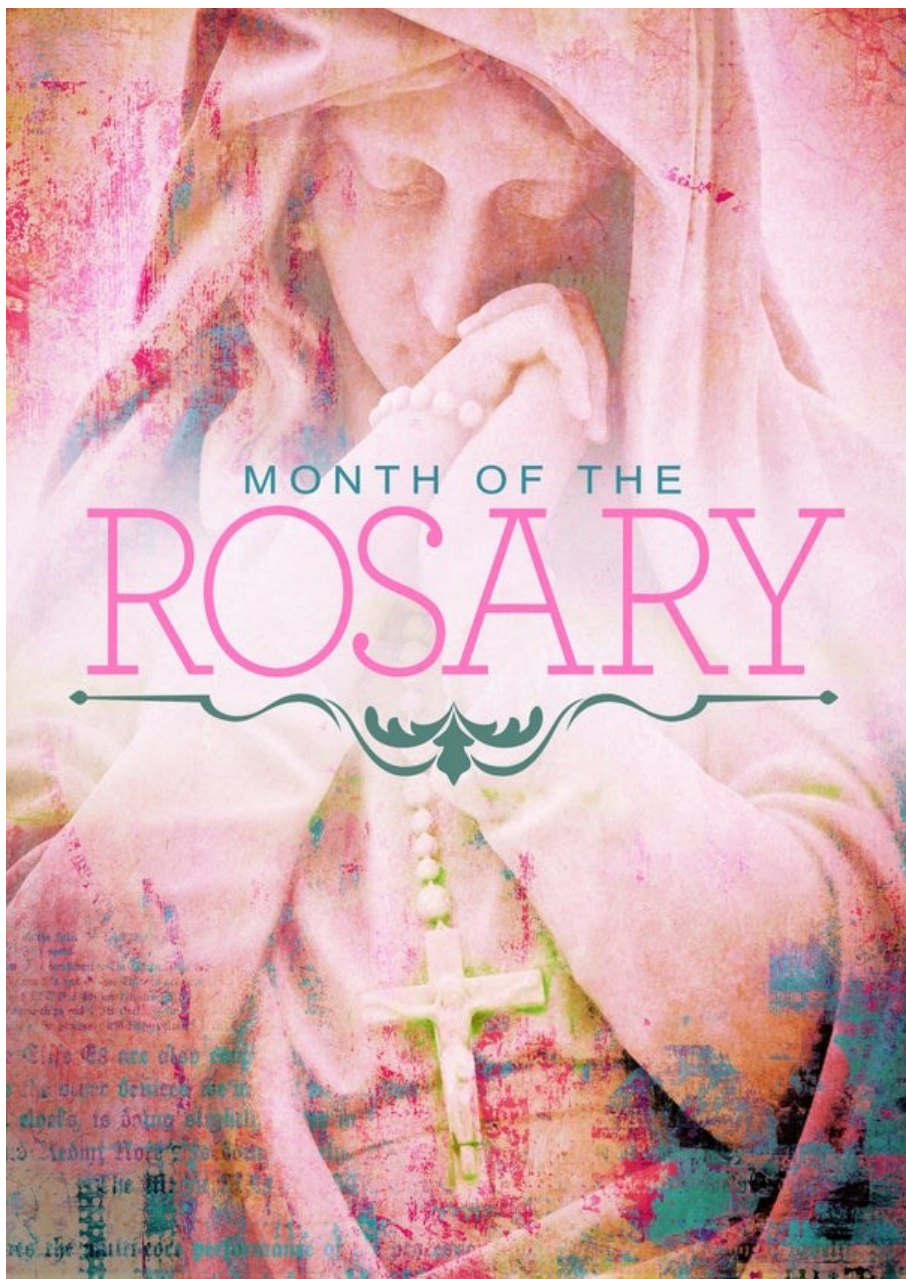

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE**

Parishioners registered for a minimum of one year are eligible to marry at our churches. Six months of marriage preparation prior to your wedding is required by the Archdiocese of Omaha. Contact your Parish Office to schedule a wedding date and marriage preparation instruction.

**SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM**

Contact your parish office for Preparation Class. All baptismal sponsors, unless they are registered St. Anthony, St. Bonaventure or St. Stanislaus, must have a letter of recommendation from the parish from which they are registered indicating that they are a Catholic in good standing. The letter must come to the church office before the baptism is officially set.

Fetal viability means the point in pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the patient's treating health care practitioner, there is a significant likelihood of the fetus' sustained survival outside the uterus without the application of extraordinary medical measures.
